One thing have I desired of the Lord, which I will require \* even that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, to behold the fair beauty of the Lord, and to visit his temple. For in the time of trouble he shall hide me in his tabernacle \* yea, in the secret place of his dwelling shall he hide me, and set me up upon a rock of stone. And now shall he lift up mine head \* above mine enemies round about me. Therefore will I offer in his dwelling an oblation with great gladness \* I will sing, and speak praises unto the Lord. Hearken unto my voice, O Lord, when I cry unto thee \* have mercy upon me, and hear me. My heart hath talked of thee, Seek ye my face \* Thy face, Lord, will I seek. O hide not thou thy face from me \* nor cast thy servant away in displeasure. Thou hast been my succour \* leave me not, neither forsake me, O God of my salvation. When my father and my mother forsake me \* the Lord taketh me up. Teach me thy way, O Lord \* and lead me in the right way, because of mine enemies. Deliver me not over into the will of mine adversaries \* for there are false witnesses risen up against me, and such as speak wrong. I should utterly have fainted \* but that I believe verily to see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living. O tarry thou the Lord's leisure \* be strong, and he shall comfort thine heart; and put thou thy trust in the Lord.

### Second Reading: Philippians 3:17-4:1

Brothers and sisters, join in imitating me, and observe those who live according to the example you have in us. For many live as enemies of the cross of Christ; I have often told you of them, and now I tell you even with tears. Their end is destruction; their god is the belly; and their glory is in their shame; their minds are set on earthly things. But our citizenship is in heaven, and it is from there that we are expecting a Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ. He will transform the body of our humiliation so that it may be conformed to the body of his glory, by the power that also enables him to make all things subject to himself. Therefore, my brothers and sisters, whom I love

and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm in the Lord in this way, my beloved. Please stand for the gradual hymn (NEH 63).
