**On Saturday 24th September the Church Council** met to clarify the Chaplaincy's attitude to who can minister here at St George's. After a gracious and thorough discussion the following was adopted : We resolve to accept the ministry here at St George's of women ordained as Bishops and Priests in the Church of England. To ensure that all are able to flourish here at St George's we will adopt the following practices

- The list of celebrant and preachers at the Eucharist will be published termly.
- The Reserved Sacrament for the Sick and for the Adoration of the Sacrament will be the responsibility of the Chaplain and any assistant clergy ordained by a male bishop.
- The Oils (Healing, Catechumens, Chrism) will be sourced from our Diocesan bishop or a bishop ordained by a male bishop.

For adults the group will meet on Tuesday evenings at 7.30, from September 27th to November 15th inclusive in principle but we can also make arrangements to suit individual needs.
