Commendation and Farewell

Let us commend Angela to the mercy of God, our maker and redeemer.

Silence is kept.

As the the choir sings the Kontakion for the Dead (NEH 526) Angela's coffin will be surrounded with incense—a symbol of our prayers, and washed in Holy Water—symbol of our baptism.

Kontakion of the Dead

Support us, O Lord, all the day long of this troublous life, until the shadows lengthen and the evening comes, the busy world is hushed, the fever of life is over and our work is done. Then, Lord, in your mercy grant us a safe lodging, a holy rest, and peace at the last; through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

In peace now, let us take Angela to her final resting place.

For those in peril on the sea.


O Saviour, whose almighty word

Eucharistic Prayer




It is right to give thanks and praise.
