The Holy and Undivided Trinity: 4th June 2023

A warm welcome to St George's worship this week—online or in person. Today the choir is on holiday and we are using the congregational setting of the Eucharist by John Merbecke (c.1510-c.1585). Born in Yorkshire Merbecke was tried for heresy under Henry VIII but pardoned by Bishop Stephen Gardener because 'he was only a musician'. He set the liturgy of the Book of Common Prayer to semi-rhythmical melodies partly adapted from Gregorian chant and his music was rediscovered in the late 19th century.



Invitation to Communion

All are welcome to receive Holy Communion if you do so in your own church. **Please do not intinct** (dip the bread into the common cup) as it has been banned by the bishops. If you would prefer, please come forward and bow your head for a blessing. Please follow the directions of the Sides-people. If you are watching online or don't want to receive Holy Communion you may like to use the following prayer:

My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Blessed Sacrament, I love you above all things and I desire you in my soul.

Since I cannot receive you now sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my soul.

As though you were already there I embrace you and unite myself wholly to you; permit not that I should ever be separated from you. Amen.

Post Communion Prayer

Almighty and eternal God, you have revealed yourself as Father, Son and Holy Spirit,

that sittest at the right hand of God the Father, have mercy upon us. For thou only art holy; thou only art the Lord; thou only, O Christ, with the Holy Ghost, art the Most High in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

Opening Prayer

Almighty and everlasting God, you have given us your servants grace, by the confession of a true faith, to acknowledge the glory of the eternal Trinity and in the power of the divine majesty to worship the Unity: keep us steadfast in this faith, that we may evermore be defended from all adversities; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**

First Reading: Isaiah 40:12-17, 27-31

Who has measured the waters in the hollow of his hand and marked off the heavens with a span, enclosed the dust of the earth in a measure, and weighed the mountains in scales and the hills in a balance? Who has directed the spirit of the Lord, or as his counsellor has instructed him? Whom did he consult for his enlightenment, and who taught him the path of justice? Who taught him knowledge, and showed him the way of understanding? Even the nations are like a drop from a bucket, and are accounted as dust on the scales; see, he takes up the isles like fine dust. Lebanon would not provide fuel enough, nor are its animals enough for a burnt-offering. All the nations are as nothing before him; they are accounted by him as less than nothing and emptiness. Why do you say, O Jacob, and speak, O Israel, 'My way is hidden from the Lord, and my right is disregarded by my God'? Have you not known? Have you not heard? The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He does not faint or grow weary; his understanding is unsearchable. He gives power to the faint, and strengthens the powerless. Even youths will faint and be weary, and the young will fall exhausted; but those who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength, they shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint.

Please remain seated to sing, instead of the psalm for the day (Psalm 8), a hymn (NEH 144) :

Father most holy, merciful and tender Jesus our Saviour, with the Father reigning, Spirit all kindly, Advocate, Defender, Light never waning;

Trinity sacred, Unity unshaken,
Deity perfect, giving and forgiving,
Light of the angels, Life of the forsaken, Hope of all living;

Maker of all things, all thy creatures praise thee; Lo all things serve thee through thy whole creation: Hear us, Almighty, hear us as we raise thee Hearts adoration

To the all-ruling triune God be glory: Highest and greatest, help thou our endeavour; We too would praise thee, giving honour worthy Now and for ever. Amen.

Finally, brothers and sisters, farewell. Put things in order, listen to my appeal, agree with one another, live in peace; and the God of love and peace will be with

you. Greet one another with a holy kiss. All the saints greet you. The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with all of you.


