

Art by art shall be assailed; to the cross shall Life be nailed; from the grave shall hope be hailed: So, behold, All the gates of heaven unfold.

Holy Gospel: Mark 13:24-37

'But in those days, after that suffering, the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will be falling from heaven, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. Then they will see "the Son of Man coming in clouds" with great power and glory. Then he will send out the angels, and gather his elect from the four winds, from the ends of the earth to the ends of heaven. From the fig tree learn its lesson: as soon as its branch becomes tender and puts forth its leaves, you know that

summer is near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that he is near, at the very gates.
