As the bell rings, we stand. During Advent part of the Advent Prose (REH 636) is used as an Entrance Antiphon. We then sing the first hymn (REH 22):

That into exile drear is gone Far from the face of God's dear Son.
Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel Shall come to thee, O Israel.**

**O come, thou Wisdom from on high, Who makes all in earth and sky
Creating man from dust and clay: To us reveal salvation's way.**

**O come, O come Adonai, Who in thy glorious majesty
From Sinai's mountain, clothed with awe, Gavest thy folk the ancient law.**

**O come, thou root of Jesse, draw The quarry from the lion's claw;
From the dread caverns of the grave, From nether hell, thy people save.**

**O come, thou Lord of David's key! The royal door fling wide and free:
Safeguard fro us the heavenward road, And bar the way to death's abode.**

**O come, O come, thou dayspring bright! Pour on our souls thy healing light;
Dispel the long night's lingering gloom, And pierce the shadows of the tomb.**

**O come, desire of nations, show Thy kingly reign on earth below;

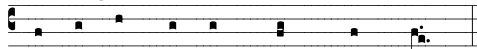

Liturgy of the Word

Sunday School leave for their activities as we listen to the Word of God

First Reading: Isaiah 7:10-16

Again the Lord spoke to Ahaz, saying, Ask a sign of the Lord your God; let it be deep as Sheol or high as heaven. But Ahaz said, I will not ask, and I will not put the Lord to the test. Then Isaiah said: 'Hear then, O house of David! Is it too little for you to weary mortals, that you weary my God also? Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Look, the young woman is with child and shall bear a son, and shall name him Immanuel. He shall eat curds and honey by the time he knows how to refuse the evil and choose the good. For before the child knows how to refuse the evil and choose the good, the land before whose two kings you are in dread will be deserted.

Please remain seated for the choir to sing the antiphon for the day (REH LI 7) and the Magnificat.

O Dayspring, Brightness of light everlasting, and sun of righteousness: Come, and enlighten him that sitteth in darkness, and the shadow of death.

My soul doth magnify the Lord. And my spirit hath rejoiced in God my Saviour. For he hath regarded: the lowliness of his handmaiden: For behold, from henceforth: all generations shall call me blessed. For he that is mighty hath magnified me: and holy is his Name. And his mercy is on them that fear him: throughout all generations. He hath shewed strength with his arm: he hath scattered the proud in the imagination of their hearts. He hath put down the mighty from their seat: and hath exalted the humble and meek. He hath filled the hungry with good things: and the rich he hath sent empty away. He remembering his mercy hath holpen his servant Israel: As he promised to our forefathers, Abraham and his seed for ever. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son and to the Holy Ghost; As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be: world without end. Amen.

Gospel: Matthew 1:18-25

Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to dismiss her quietly. But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, 'Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.' All this took place to fulfil what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet: 'Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel', which means, 'God is with us.' When Joseph awoke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took her as his wife, but had no marital relations with her until she had borne a son; and he named him Jesus.

And so a promise soon did run: That he'd redeem us by his Son.**

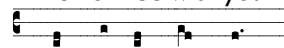
**At at this season of the year Our blest Redeemer did appear,

And he that does believe in me, From all his sins I'll set him free.'**

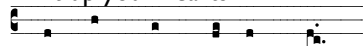
